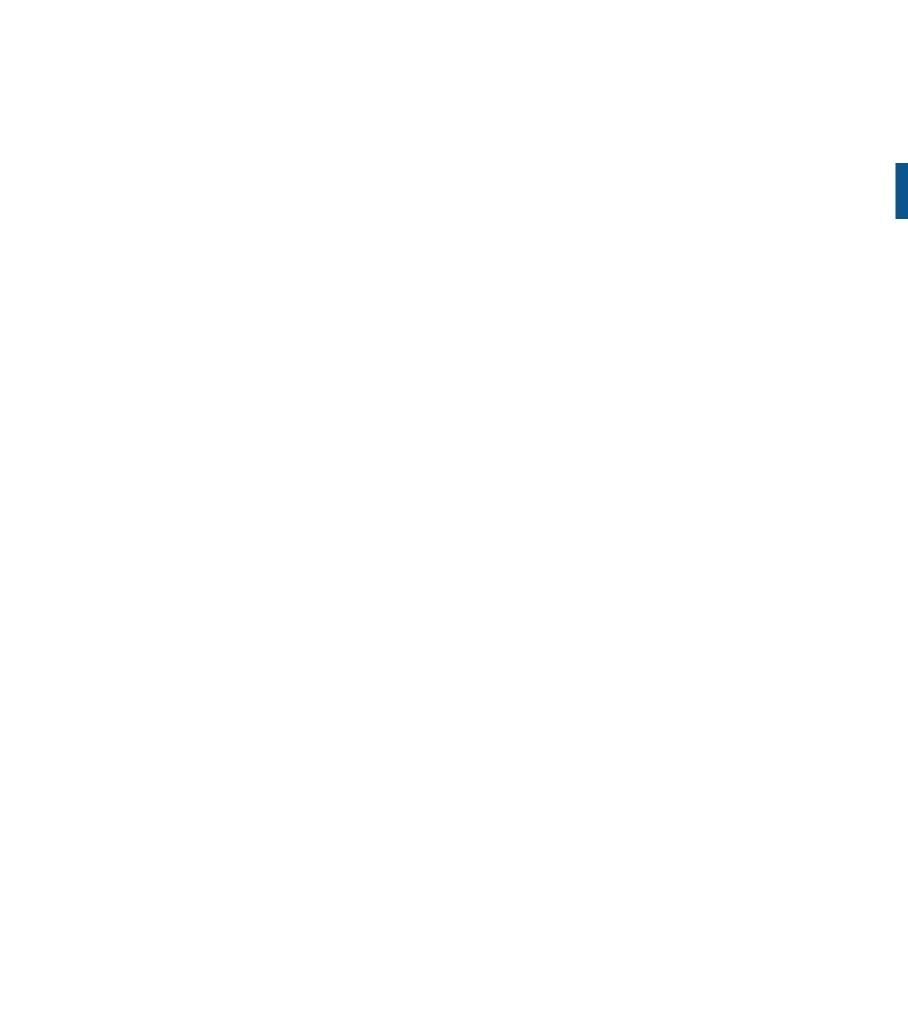

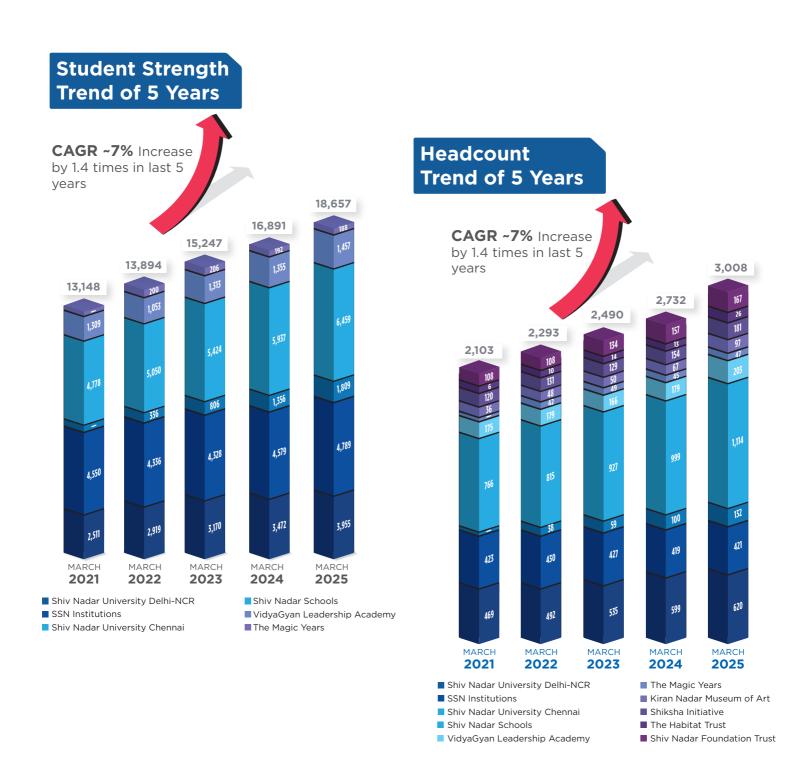

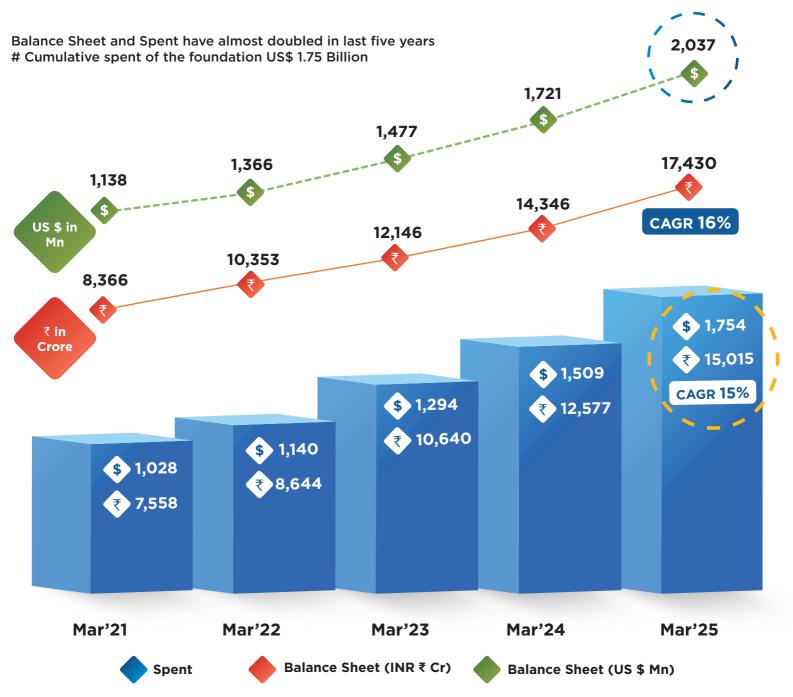

NEW MILESTONES IN OUR JOURNEY



SSN Institutions secured a NIRF 2024 ranking of 46th among engineering colleges, 81st overall, and topped private affiliated institutions in India. It earned a Gold STAR rating by AASHE for sustainability, scoring full marks in innovation. Selected by MeitY for the 5G Use Case Lab and Chips to Startup initiative. Faculty filed 37 patents and published 640 international papers. Students excelled in hackathons, national sports, and AI fellowships. Placements were strong, with a highest CTC of ₹88 LPA and 200+ offers above ₹10 LPA. SSN Incubation Foundation supported 52 startups, raising ₹1,143 lakh in equity, and ₹5,800 lakh in turnover.

VidyaGyan shines with Grade 12 toppers scoring up to 97.2% and Grade 10 achieving 99.2%, showcasing academic excellence. Students gained global exposure through Japan's YFU and USA's KL-YES programs, with five students and two teachers attending CERN's Master Class, and two selected for ITER-IYNS internships. Sports triumphs include CBSE Cluster and North Zone 1st positions in Athletics, Football, and Handball, plus Subroto Cup win with a ₹25,000 scholarship. Nine students secured international university spots (e.g., NYU Abu Dhabi) with full scholarships, while sustainability efforts saved ₹85 lakh. Community initiatives like Anubandh 2.0 and 'End the Silence' empowered well-being.





SNU Delhi-NCR launched dual-degree programs in Computer Science and Business Data Analytics with Arizona State University, earning the 'University of the Year 2024 - Emerging Category' by FICCI. The university filed 27 patents, ranked among India's Top 6 Institutions of Eminence, and added 45 new placement partners like PwC India and Fidelity International. Seven faculty members featured in Stanford's Top 2% Scientists List, while Dr. Yamini Sudha Sistla won a \$25,000 climate prize. Events like the GTIPA Summit and Genomics India Conference drew global leaders, reinforcing SNU's UN SDG 6 leadership and sustainability focus.



Shiv Nadar School's Faridabad campus was recognized as an 'Apple Distinguished School', the only one in Delhi-NCR among five in India. Events like TEDxSNSYouth and STEAM Conclave 2024 at Faridabad highlighted student-led sustainability projects with innovator William Kamkwamba. Chennai campus won the Sterling Schools Award for environmental leadership, hosting its first IB PYP Exhibition and STEAMphony 2025. Students excelled globally: Tavish Pahwa won tennis championships, Daksh Malik's asteroid discovery was NASA-confirmed, SNS Noida topped Robocup Asia Pacific 2024. 'Project Dosti' and 'Project Neer' won at the Harvard Impact Initiative 2024. Educators earned national recognition with 79 CENTA toppers, and leadership was honored with the Pearson International School Leader Award 2024.

In its 15th year, KNMA's collection exceeds 15,000 artworks, spanning classical to contemporary South Asian art. The museum unveiled a new visual identity in April 2024 and plans to become South Asia's largest cultural centre (one million square feet) for 2026. FY 2025 saw record engagement with 346,932 visitors and 400+ events, including the hit exhibition 'Walking Through a Songline' (1,595 daily visitors). Over 20 exhibitions, five international, featured 'MIRROR/MAZE' and 'The Elemental You'. Global collaborations included the 60th Venice Biennale, while 601 schools and 172 workshops expanded access, with public art initiatives like 'Art Passage' engaging thousands.





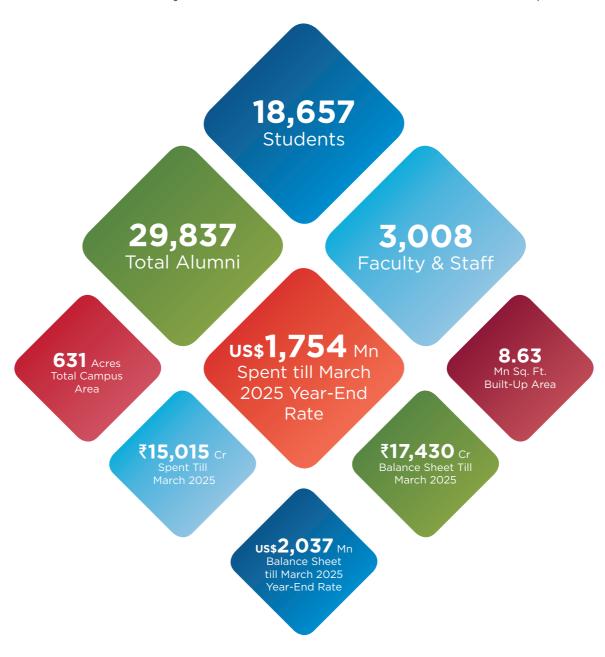
In 2024, Shiv Nadar University Chennai launched the Shiv Nadar Law School, hosting its first Law Scholarship Day, Founding Batch Degree Awarding Ceremony, and Shubharambham, welcoming 500+ students. Research grew via MoUs with Ramachandra University, IGCAR, and a tripartite AI stroke diagnostics agreement with Sri Chitra Tirunal Institute and IIT Madras. Faculty secured ₹2.5 crore in funding, filed eight patents, and published 50+ peer-reviewed papers. Law faculty contributed to national legal publications, while students participated in 30+ academic events, including HackHarvard. The B.Com. (Hons.) program achieved 100% internship and placement for eligible students.

The Shiksha Initiative expanded to 31 districts in Uttar Pradesh, impacting 3.5 lakh students, 20,000 teachers, and 2,165 villages across 30,000 schools. The UMANG program supported 15,000 early-grade students in 477 schools, improving learning outcomes in 507 schools—Hindi proficiency rose from 37% to 70%, English from 24% to 57%, and Math from 47% to 75%. SHIKSHA Plus made 1.9 lakh adults literate across 11 districts, training 2,500 volunteers with 10 NGO partners. The jail initiative reached 3,294 inmates, and the Kiran program mainstreamed 57 children. Teacher training trained 34,000 educators, earning a UNESCO Literacy Prize 2024 nomination.

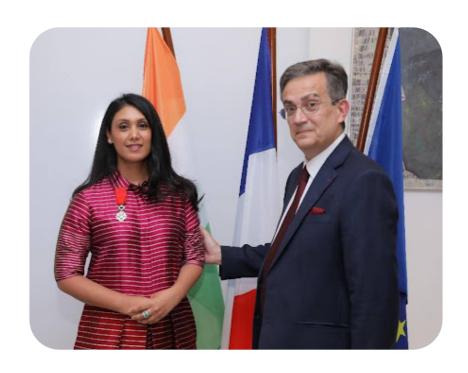

INTRODUCTION

SSN Institutions continue to stand at the forefront of higher education in India. delivering exceptional performance across academics. research, innovation, sustainability, and student outcomes. In the 2024 NIRF rankings by the Ministry of Education, Government of India, SSN was ranked 46th among Indian engineering institutions and 81st among all educational institutions in India, emerging as the top-ranked private affiliated institution in India and the only one in its category to feature among the top 100 in NIRF 2024.

KEY HIGHLIGHTS









- SSN was ranked 46th among engineering colleges and 81st overall in NIRF 2024, making it the top private affiliated institution in India.
- SSN iFound has supported 52 start-ups, enabling them to raise ₹1,143 lakhs in equity and secure ₹231 lakhs in grant funding, with a combined valuation of ₹13,750 lakhs.
- Students and alumni achieved national distinction across sports, civil services, entrepreneurship, and global accolades including the Padma Shri and Forbes 30 Under 30.
- SSN was selected by Ministry of Electronics and IT (MeitY) for two national initiatives:
 - To establish a 5G Use Case Lab, aimed at building competencies in 5G technologies among students and start-ups, preparing India for a 6G-ready ecosystem.
 - To participate in the Chips to Startup (C2S) initiative, which focuses on strengthening the semiconductor ecosystem by promoting innovation, research, and developing skilled manpower in chip design and embedded systems.

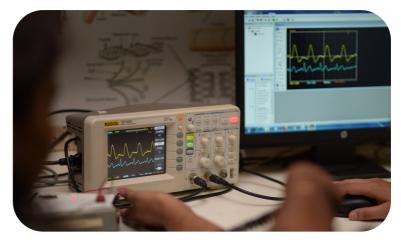


FACULTY

- The institution's research ecosystem continues to thrive with 640 international publications and 37 patents granted in the last year alone, bringing the overall patent count to 58.
- SSN's Field-Weighted Citation Impact (FWCI) of 1.28 surpasses the global average.
- 21 new externally funded projects worth ₹720.90 lakhs further deepened the culture of innovation and inquiry. Over the years, SSN has produced 588 PhDs, published over 4,700 international papers in the last decade, and executed 207 research projects valued at ₹6,963.09 lakhs.
- Notably, three faculty members have been named to Stanford University's Elsevier 'Top 2% Scientists in the World' list for the fourth consecutive year.
- The institution also celebrated individual excellence with Dr. Muthu Senthil Pandian, AP, receiving an ACS Certificate of Recognition and Appreciation from American Chemical Society, Washington, U.S., and Dr. J. Vijay, ASP, BME, being honored with the Imagine Award 2024 for Education Excellence.

SSN's global alumni network remains vibrant and engaged, with recent gatherings in cities like London, drawing enthusiastic participation from graduates and their families. Philanthropic efforts remain a cornerstone of alumni engagement, with initiatives last year generating over ₹21 lakhs in scholarships, reflecting a deep and enduring connection with the institution.

- Hari Madhavan, a fourth-year Mechanical Engineering student, secured the Silver medal at the prestigious International FIDE Rapid Rating Chess Tournament 2024, showcasing exceptional strategic skill on a global stage.
- Rishab, a third-year Computer Science Engineering student, won the Silver medal in the 3,000-meter relay at the 60th National Roller Skating Championship. His national-level achievement was recognized by the Sports Development Authority of Tamil Nadu (SDAT) with a cash award of ₹2 lakh.
- The institution's Apex Racing Team earned national recognition, including second place in 'Innovation' at the Indian Karting Race, demonstrating the integration of technical skill and competitive spirit.

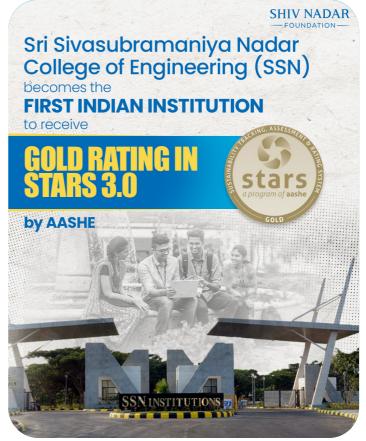
SUSTAINABILITY INITIATIVES

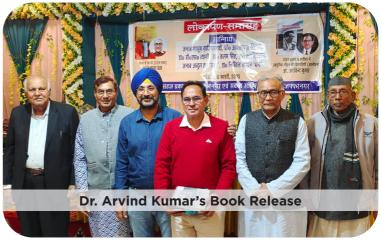

Established on April 4th, 2011, Shiv Nadar University Delhi-NCR stands as a benchmark of private university excellence in India. In 2022, it was conferred the status of 'Institution of Eminence' by the Ministry of Education under UGC regulations in recognition of its vision for world-class research, innovation, and multidisciplinary learning spanning across Chemistry, Sociology, Economics, Civil Engineering, and the Arts.

Situated on a 286-acre green campus, Shiv Nadar University Delhi-NCR is built for intellectual and creative exploration. The built-up area spans over 310,208 square meters and includes academic blocks, hostels, libraries, faculty housing, a preschool for children of faculty and staff, a biodiversity park, a nine-hole golf course, a recreational club, and robust sports infrastructure for nurturing a truly holistic learning environment.

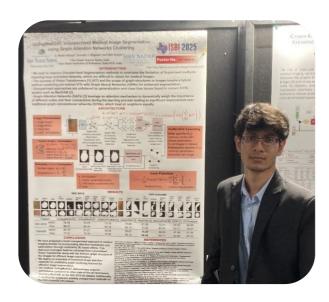
National Recognition at CENTA Teaching Professionals' Olympiad

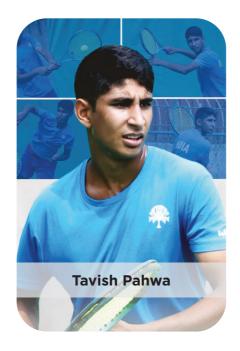

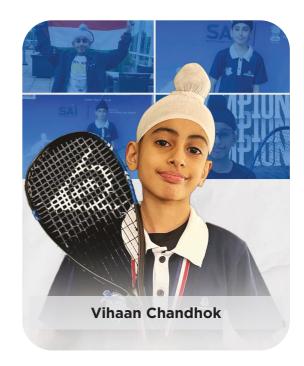
Multiple students excelled in national and international events. These achievements reflect the school's focus on holistic development.

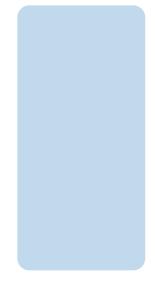


SPORTS

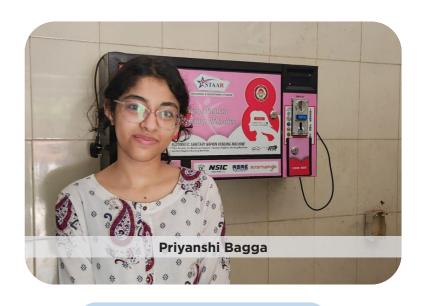

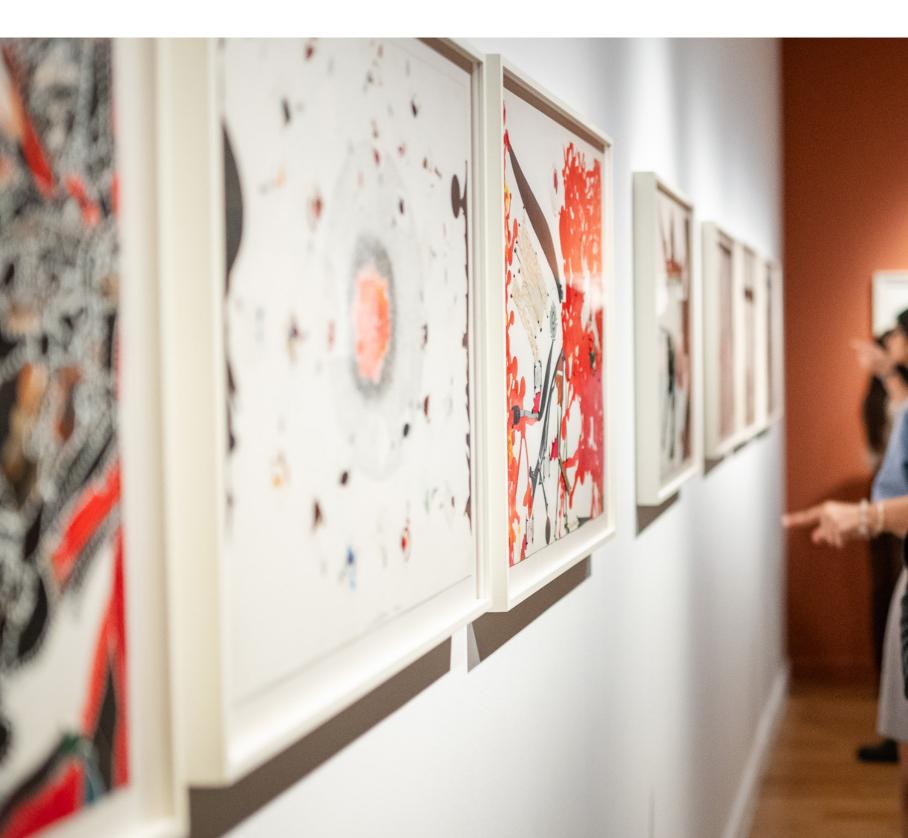
COMMUNITY INITIATIVES

INTRODUCTION

Established in 2010, the Kiran Nadar Museum of Art (KNMA) is South Asia's first private museum dedicated to modern and contemporary art. As a not-for-profit institution, KNMA has championed a culture of museum-going in India through curated exhibitions, educational programs, cultural events, and publications. Its growing collection now spans over 15,000 artworks across classical, modern, folk, and contemporary practices from India and South Asia.

In April 2024, KNMA unveiled a new visual identity and logo, marking its evolving vision. Now in its 15th year, the museum remains rooted in the belief that art is for all. It is preparing to launch South Asia's largest art and cultural centre; an expansive one million square foot space designed to support, preserve, and celebrate art.





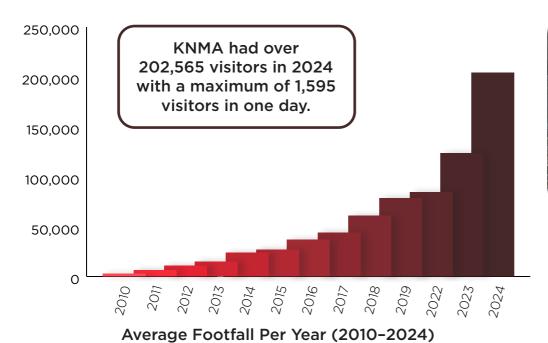




- •Record-breaking footfalls: FY 2024-25 drew in **200,194 visitors** across **400 events**; a twofold increase from the previous year.
- Walking Through a Songline, presented with the National Museum of Australia, became KNMA's most-visited exhibition to date, averaging **1,595 visitors** daily over its 38-day run in May-June, 2024.
- •With consistent growth in footfalls since inception in 2010, the year saw a sharp surge in the same.

- The second edition of *CentreStage Weekend* (November 2024) showcased emerging artists engaged in eclectic practices within dance and music.
- The second edition of the Legacy Series presented acclaimed sarangi maestro Murad Ali Khan's enduring musical lineage in January 2025.
- KNMA in the Park returned in February 2025 with immersive performances by Beat Route and Jimmy Mansa.











CULTURAL & EDUCATION OUTREACH

- Collaborated with the Embassies of Hungary, Poland, Australia, Denmark, Italy, Ireland, and Spain to celebrate artistic achievements and foster cross-cultural exchanges.
- Welcomed 601 schools, colleges, and NGOs through museum tours, workshops, and special learning modules as part of the museum's expansive educational outreach.
- Conducted 51 community-led, hands-on art and craft workshops at Resident Welfare Associations (RWA) across Delhi-NCR.
- Across the year the museum hosted nearly 250 public programs,, including 17 Methods Series workshops, 32 Artist in Me sessions, 62 Saturday Family Workshops, 15 City as Museum walks, 15 talks, 24 film screenings, and 14 #WeekendsatKNMA events at Saket and Noida.









- Built and fostered cross-geographic relationships with partner institutions in Dharamshala, Kolkata, London, and Venice.
- The recurring Craftopia summer camp and Art Battle interschool competition engaged over 1,400 school children from Delhi-NCR in creative, participatory formats.

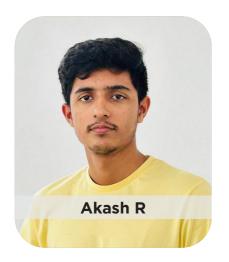

UMANG

These tactile learning kits strengthen early cognitive and language development in foundational years.

PREPARATORY STAGE

In a historic first. Mathematics was introduced for Class Nine at GGIC Kamalapur, established in 1960. All eight students who opted for the subject passed with marks ranging from 53 to 97.

The top performer, Prachi, secured 90.3% overall getting 97 in Mathematics.



SAAR (SHIKSHA Annual Academic Report)

Implemented in 507 schools across 17 districts, reaching 11,527 students.

INTRODUCTION

Founded in 2018 by Mrs. Roshni Nadar Malhotra and Mr. Shikhar Malhotra, The Habitats Trust (THT) works to protect India's natural habitats and native biodiversity through cohesive action across forests, grasslands, deserts, swamps, islands and oceans. Recognizing that on-ground conservation has historically focused on charismatic megafauna, THT was designed to close the gap for lesser-known species and smaller mammals, taking a collaborative and scientific approach that brings together government agencies, armed forces, research bodies, NGOs, and local communities.

THT now operates across 32 States & UTs with 130+ on-ground partners, enabling conservation for 50+ species and channeling grants to 60+ organizations/individuals through eight programs spanning terrestrial and freshwater, marine, restoration, behavioural science, education & awareness, technology, and grants.



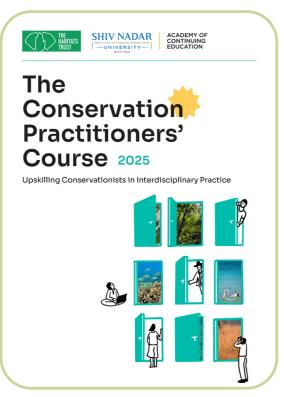

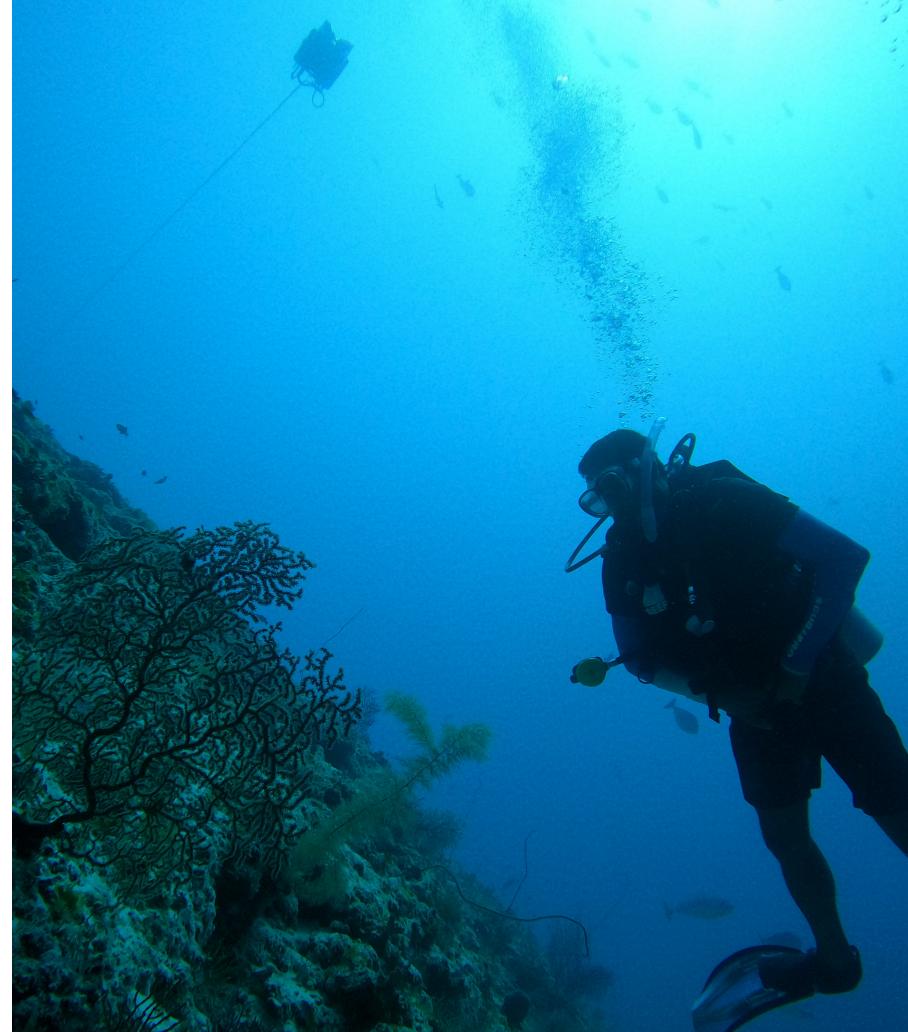

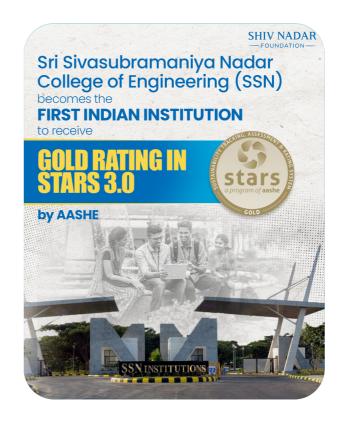

FOUNDATION DOSSIER

In FY 2024-25, the Shiv Nadar Foundation's trustees and institutions earned wide recognition for excellence across education, conservation, art and culture. Mr. Shiv Nadar topped the EdelGive-Hurun India Philanthropy List 2024 and received the Santokbaa Humanitarian Award for his enduring contributions to education and nation-building. Mrs. Roshni Nadar Malhotra was honored with the Chevalier de la Légion d'Honneur and named IAA Business Leader of the Year; she was also ranked #81 on Forbes' World's Most Powerful Women 2024.

Shiv Nadar University Delhi-NCR launched dual-degree pathways with Arizona State University and hosted global convenings such as the GTIPA Summit and Genomics India Conference; seven faculty members were featured in Stanford University's Top 2% scientists list, with citations in the 2025 U.S. Presidential Economic Report.

SSN Institutions strengthened their leadership with notable achievements, including securing NIRF 2024 ranks of 46 (Engineering) and 81 (Overall). The institution was also selected by MeitY for a 5G Use Case Lab, achieved standout student placements and start-up outcomes, and earned an AASHE STARS Gold rating for sustainability.

Shiv Nadar University Chennai expanded its portfolio with the launch of the Shiv Nadar Law School, new national research MoUs and competitive grants.

Shiv Nadar Schools earned the Apple Distinguished School designation for the Faridabad campus. Ms. Anju Wal, Director of Education and former Director-Principal (Faridabad), was awarded the Pearson International School Leader of the Year 2024 - Asia Region.

VidyaGyan marked its prominence with its alumni securing admissions to the Ivy League and other renowned international institutions; students gained international exposure (CERN, ITER-IYNS) and advanced impactful student-led community programs. The institution also expanded its presence with the foundation stone laid for VidyaGyan Chennai.

The SHIKSHA Initiative scaled foundational learning and adult literacy across Uttar Pradesh and was nominated for the UNESCO Literacy Prize 2024.

Kiran Nadar Museum of Art (KNMA) marked a landmark year of audience engagement with 400+ public programs, major exhibitions in India and abroad (including the Venice Biennale) and continued progress toward a world-class cultural center.

The Habitats Trust deepened its conservation footprint through strategic MoUs with the Indian Coast Guard and Indian Navy, advanced reef science with ROV surveys in Lakshadweep, launched the Conservation Practitioners' Course and initiated large-scale restoration in Tadoba, Maharashtra.

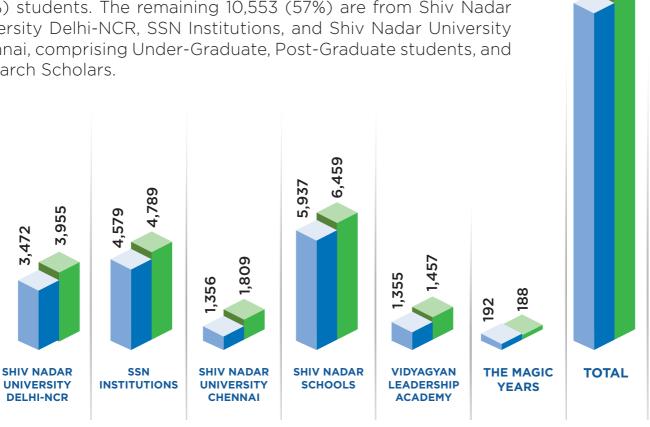

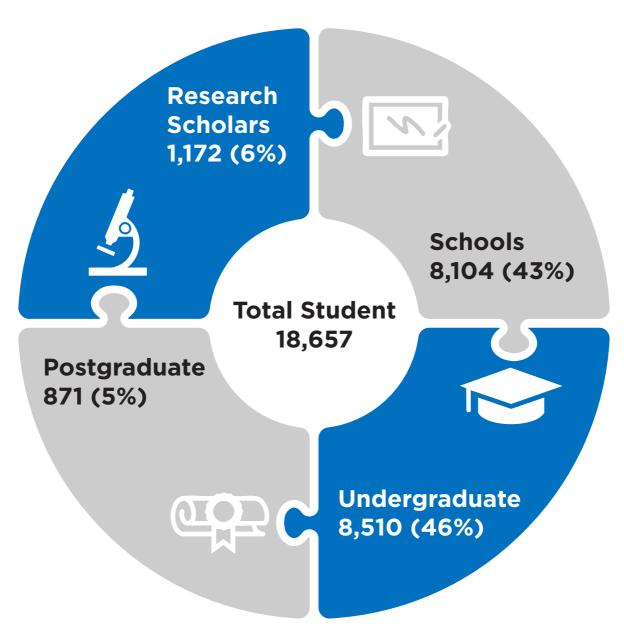
Mix Of Students

 Research scholars include 489 Students of Shiv Nadar University Delhi-NCR, 623 students of SSNI and 60 students of SNU Chennai

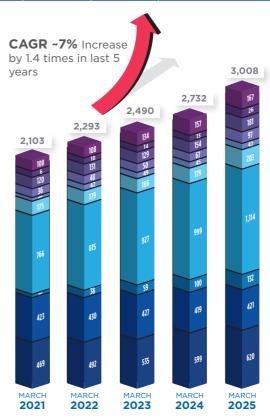

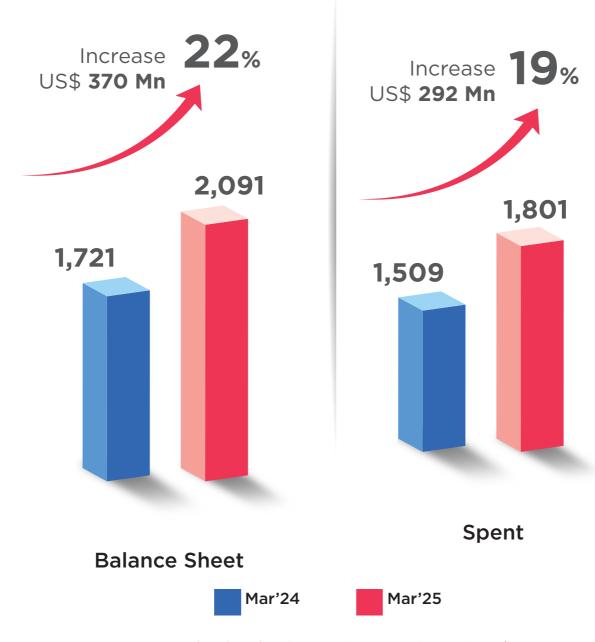

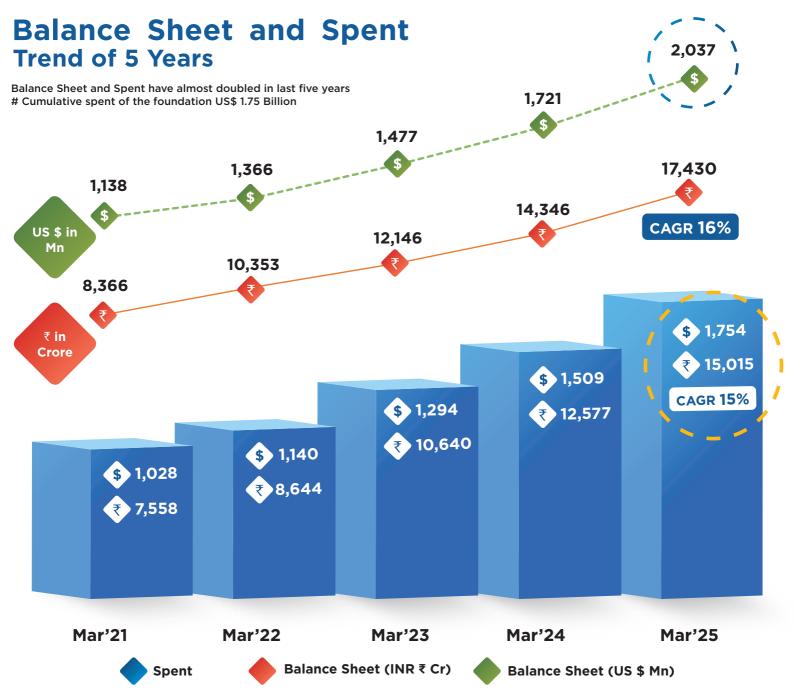

Additionally, Scholarships worth US\$ 0.22 Mn awarded to 34 VidyaGyan students to pursue higher education.

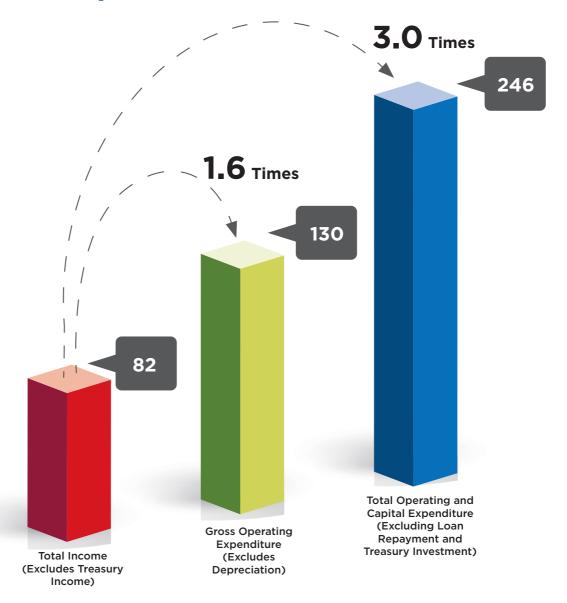
Income and Expenditure (₹ in Crore)
